

FATHER PAT'S SERMON NOTES

The 8th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Be Focused, Act Smartly, Get Connected!

Lent begins this week. Are you ready to make the best of it? I have three suggestions that may help motivate you as you get started.

First, GET FOCUSED. This year BEFORE you decide what you are going to give up or take on, decide where you want to END up when the journey is over! Who do you want to become, what kind of person do you want to be? If you are going to run this 40-Day Marathon we call the Lenten Season, don't wander *aim-less-ly* in the desert – decide beforehand on the outcome you want to achieve.

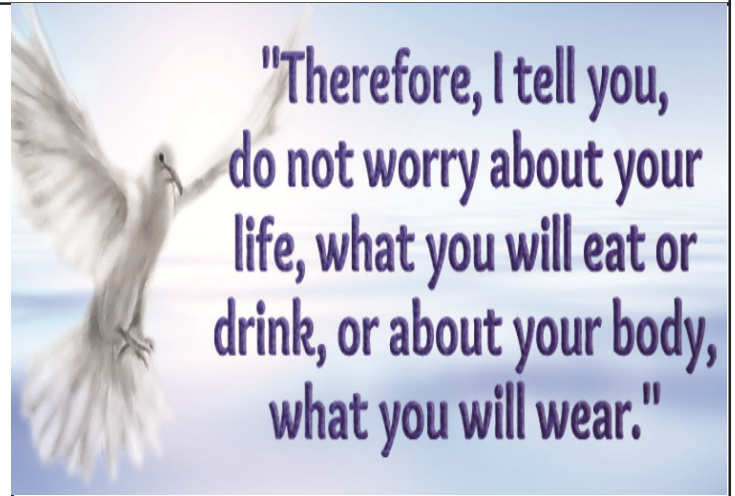
Second, GET SMART. Now knowing where you want to end up (being a more giving person, a thoughtful spouse, a worthy mentor, a better parent, a caring sibling, a more engaged parishioner, a consistently positive presence in the workplace, etc.), plan accordingly! Giving up music for Lent when music relaxes you and brings you to a peaceful place is probably not going to make you a better person! Similarly, giving up caffeine for Lent and driving your co-workers insane is counterproductive! Picking up an extra cup of coffee for someone else in the office makes a lot more sense! Remember, Lent is a time to develop NEW HABITS that once established are a part of the NEW YOU long after Lent is over.

Third, GET CONNECTED. That is, connect everything you do with real people or circumstances that affect real people. This is very important. If you are going to commit to pray more often, pray for specific intentions or people. If you are going to start or renew a commitment to reading scripture, decide before you close the bible what specific action (no matter how small or subtle like a phone call, an email, a kind word) that you will take in light of what you just read. When you fast or abstain from a meal, read an article or watch a short video on world hunger; pray for them and look up a place locally you can donate food or volunteer to feed. When you connect your Lenten disciplines to concrete opportunities to make a difference, the one who will benefit most is YOU. Mission accomplished!
