Fifth Sunday of Lent

What Do You Believe Christ Can Achieve?


Someone once said that those who say "I can!" and those who say, "I can't!" usually both turn out to be correct! There is an undeniable connection between what we believe and what we achieve. This is no less true than when it comes to faith in Jesus Christ. What HE can and will achieve in your life will largely be determined by the degree to which you put faith in him. Maybe you have struggled to overcome vices, defeatist attitudes, and crippling beliefs that have consistently stifled your progress in the pursuit of holiness as a Christian and wholeness as a human being. You have tried to change, grow and learn to live a different and better life but too often feel you have failed miserably. Maybe you have! But you would do well to take a cue from Martha who in her grief first exclaimed: "Lord, if only you have been here..." only to follow up with an expression of indomitable faith "but even now I know...!" Yes, even now, she said, four days after her brother's death she still believed there was something that Jesus could do to restore her hope. What do you believe Christ can achieve? Do you believe he has an answer even for hopeless situations? Remember, this is the same God who promised the prophet Ezekiel: "I will open your graves and have you rise from them!" (Ezekiel 37).

"Do you believe?" is the question that Jesus asks Martha and Mary and everyone who considers the invitation to be one of his disciples. This is the question that will be posed and repeated thousands of times at Easter Vigil celebrations all over the world as men and women and young people are welcomed into full communion with the Catholic Church. This question will be repeatedly asked of us when we renew our baptismal promises on Easter Sunday. Our claims about Jesus, for some, seem unbelievable. But as disciples of Jesus Christ our outlook is not limited to conventional wisdom of what is or is not possible. Once you align yourself with God through faith you discover the ability to see the invisible, to expect the incredible, to reach the unreachable, to move the unmovable, to conquer the unbeatable and to achieve the impossible! Most would have said that there was nothing more impressive than to see a dead man respond to the word of Jesus' command. But I dare say that it is even more impressive when the living do so!


