

FATHER PAT'S SERMON NOTES

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

What if Weeds could become Wheat?

I hated pulling weeds in the yard as a kid. I much preferred cutting the grass, or raking the leaves and bagging them afterward. If I was more familiar with the scriptures read today as a boy, I could have quoted the bible to my parents to make a case that God himself was generally against pulling weeds! **"Master"** the servant asked, **"do you want us to pull up the weeds? No, if you pull up the weeds you might uproot the wheat along with them. Let them grow together until harvest..."** I wonder what my parents would have to say about THAT!

Have you ever thought: *"The world would be a much better place if we could instantly get rid of all the bad people"*? It's a tempting proposition but if we thought it through, we'd realize that we may be unintentionally wishing our own demise or that of a family member or friend who goes astray in a moment of stupidity or desperation! God's patience is a lifeline to us: **"Do you think I take any pleasure in the death of the wicked?, 'declares the Sovereign LORD'. Rather, am I not pleased when they turn from their ways and live?"** (Ezekiel 18:23).

Jesus said that the weeds represent the wicked or children of the evil one. I think that it is safe to say that your average church-goer would not classify themselves as members of this group! However, it's not a bad idea to keep in mind that Jesus spoke of both God and the devil as Fathers; the latter being **"the Father of Lies"** (John 8:44). If you are judged only from the witness of your life, how you treat your neighbor in thought, words and actions, or where you invest most of your time and energy — would it be fair to ask the question: **"Who's your Daddy?"** So, maybe before we start seeking to exorcise our Church of all of the weeds, we might want to double check whether we are one of them. Let us then invite the weeds to repent and experience God's life changing forgiveness. For his mercy can turn weeds into wheat and hopeless cases into grateful witnesses of what the power of God can do with a heart willing to repent.
